

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Valaree Langley-Foss

With the many concerns regarding the COVID-19 virus, all USATF National Championship meets and USATF sanctioned events have been suspended indefinitely. The 2020 Olympic Games have been postponed until July 23, 2021. The 2020 USATF Hershey National Junior Olympics Track & Field Championships to be held in Jacksonville, Florida July 27-August 2 have been canceled as well as the 2020 USATF Region 1 Junior Olympic Track & Field Championships to be held at Bowdoin College in Brunswick, ME July 9-12.

During this period, Ron Kelley (youth chair) is-researching and lining up sites to hold the 2020 Youth meets. Watch for a special youth newsletter to come out later this year.

Here are some important things to remember as we begin 2020:

•2020 USATF Membership increase – effect as of May Ist, 2020. The new membership fees as of 5/1/2020 if you elect to register or renew directly online will be \$25.00 for a youth membership or \$40 for adult membership, plus a processing fee.

USATF-Maine Association gives a discount to all Youth Memberships if received via snail mail; we charge \$20.00 for the mailed-in registrations only.

•USATF has now "gone green" (paperless). **All Event Sanctions** must now be done directly online with USATF. A major Credit Card is required. Web address is:

No other background checks will be accepted. All coaches and volunteers ages 18 & older must be current year USATF members.



Officials Chair: Donald Berry

It has certainly become an eventful year for Track & Field at every level of competition. No Olympic Games, No Olympic Trials, No New Balance meet, No Regionals and I wonder what's next. Several of our Maine officials were assigned to officiate several of the National meets and that will not be occurring. Molly Winchenbach was selected as part of the Young Officials grant program and I believe that selection will be carried over to next season. We have 75 active officials here in this association. One of the concerns I have is that we have 4528 officials in the Country down from 4946 a year ago.

Now on a more serious note, several officials have paid for your membership and still have not completed your Background Checks or SafeSport. You are not a certified official until this is done. Please get it done! I cannot do the SafeSport presentation in a clinic. It is an online only program at no cost. Just a note – the pre-test questions are the same ones asked at the end of each section.

The SafeSport site is https://safesport.org/ You must do a sign-in and password for the SafeSport.

You can also still get the reduced membership fee of \$30 by registering through me before the cost goes to \$40 on May 1st. I do have rule books for all levels available. The High School Pre-Meet Notes is available at https://www.nfhs.org/media/3609791/2020-pmn_final.pdf. This 20-page publication explains several facets of our sport. The new certification rules review will contain about 75 questions and there will be one review for all levels of certification. There are no high school or NCAA questions. There could be short supplements in some areas such as referees and race walk.

Finally, I want to thank all of our officials for the great work you all do.

Para-Athletics Chair - Stephen Foss

We currently have a para-athlete by the name of Kellan Tilton, who performed in our 2019 summer youth program. This is the first time in the history of our summer youth program we have had a para-athlete and we are very proud of Kellan, reaching great accomplishments listed below. Upon finishing this accomplishment in a regular wheelchair,

he was presented with a certified USATF racing chair.

Kellan Tilton began attending practices in the "8 & under" boys division with the Winslow Summer Track and Field Program. Throughout the summer season, his determination and positive inner strength grew. We can't wait to see Kellan continue to grow in the sport in the coming years!

During the USATF-Maine Youth Championship that was held at Brewer HS in August 2019, Kellan set two new "8 & under" para-youth records. The first record Kellan set was in the wheelchair 100m dash, with a time of 39.34 sec. Kellan's second record was in the "8 & under" boys para-youth Shot Put event, with a distance of 9'03".

Congratulations Kellan. You have the support from your track and field team (Winslow Rec.) and USATF-Maine to make more of your dreams become reality.
